Westminster Larger Catechism: Question # 49

Question: How did Christ humble himself in his death?

Answer: Christ humbled himself in his death, in that having been betrayed by Judas,^a forsaken by his disciples,^b scorned and rejected by the world,^c condemned by Pilate, and tormented by his persecutors;^d having also conflicted with the terrors of death, and the powers of darkness, felt and borne the weight of God's wrath,^e he laid down his life an offering for sin,^f enduring the painful, shameful, and cursed death of the cross.^g
